

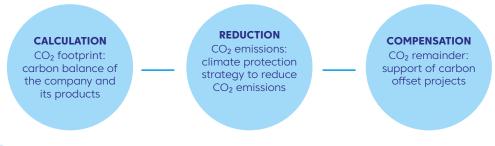
BE CLIMATE at a glance
